Historical Operations vs Mendoza Model

Historically:

- Your organization brings us 15 volunteers to earn \$500, or 30 volunteers to earn \$1,000
- Your organization completes their volunteer responsibilities in one night of operations
- Your organization receives entire payment directly after volunteering (including the 4-6 weeks of processing)

Mendoza Model:

- Your organization may bring us between 4-10 volunteers to fill 10, 20, or 30 shifts, earning your organization either \$350, \$650, or \$1,000 respectively
- Your organization may complete their volunteer responsibilities throughout the entire semester, at a pace of your choosing
- Your organization receives payment in installments after every 10 shifts you complete



THE MENDOZA MODEL

✦ Fundraising Options:

10 shifts
for \$350



20 shifts
for \$650



30 shifts
for \$1000



✦ What is a shift?



1 Volunteer = 1 Shift



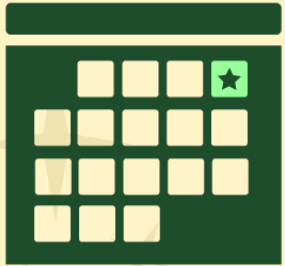
Shifts are completed in pairs: one driver, one navigator = 2 shifts



MENDOZA MODEL VISUAL EXAMPLES

★ 10 shifts for \$350

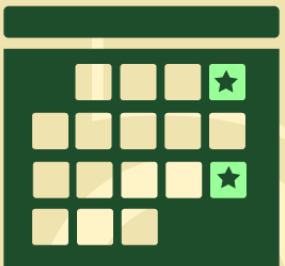
EXAMPLE 1

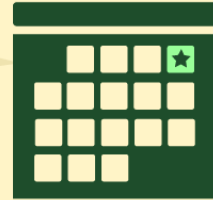
Feb. 4th: 6 volunteers = 6 shifts



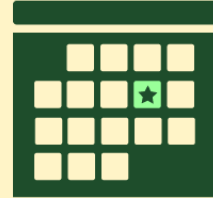
Feb. 18th: 4 volunteers = 4 shifts



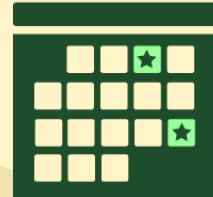
EXAMPLE 3



Feb. 4th: 2 volunteers = 2 shifts



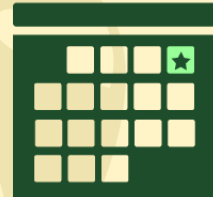
Mar. 9th: 2 volunteers = 2 shifts

Apr. 22nd: 2 volunteers = 2 shifts



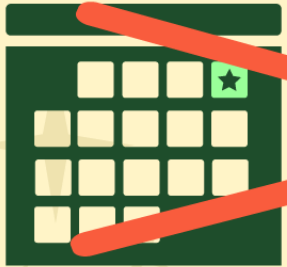
May 6th: 2 volunteers = 2 shifts



MENDOZA MODEL VISUAL EXAMPLES

★ 20 shifts for \$650

EXAMPLE 1

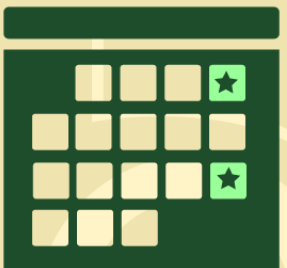


~~Feb. 4th: 20 volunteers = 20 shifts~~



Fulfilling all 20 shifts in one night is no longer an option

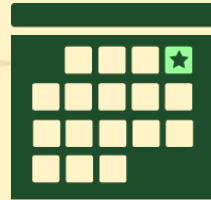
Feb. 4th: 10 volunteers = 10 shifts



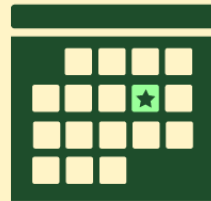
Feb. 18th: 10 volunteers = 10 shifts



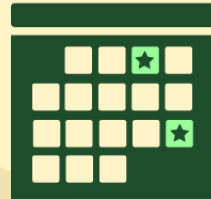
EXAMPLE 3



Feb. 4th: 4 volunteers = 4 shifts



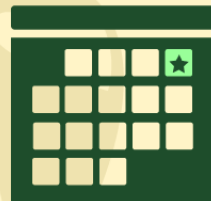
Mar. 9th: 4 volunteers = 4 shifts



Apr. 7th: 6 volunteers = 6 shifts



Apr. 22nd: 4 volunteers = 4 shifts



May 6th: 2 volunteers = 2 shifts



Important Notes Regarding Volunteering

Some important guidelines to keep in mind when selecting volunteers and shifts:

- **Your volunteers must:**
 - **Have had a U.S. Driver's License for at least one year**
 - **Pass a Motor Vehicle Records Check**
 - **Be a current CSU student**
- **Minimum volunteer requirements depending on number of shifts:**
 - **10 shifts = minimum of 4 volunteers**
 - **20 shifts = minimum of 6 volunteers**
 - **30 shifts = minimum of 8 volunteers**
- **Volunteers do not need to be members of your organization**
- **This semester, there will be no individual volunteering opportunities**



So, How Do I Volunteer?

Step 1: Determine Your Volunteers

Make sure they're ready for the commitment!

Step 2: Submit Your Docs

Head online to have your volunteers submit a copy of their driver's license and student IDs

Step 3: Identify Your Team Leader

Team Leader will meet with our Volunteer Coordinator to sign your contract

Step 4: MVR Checks

The RamRide team will submit your volunteer's docs for an MVR check

Step 5: Select Your Dates!

Choose which volunteer dates work best for your organization.

Step 6: Complete your Shifts and Get Paid!
